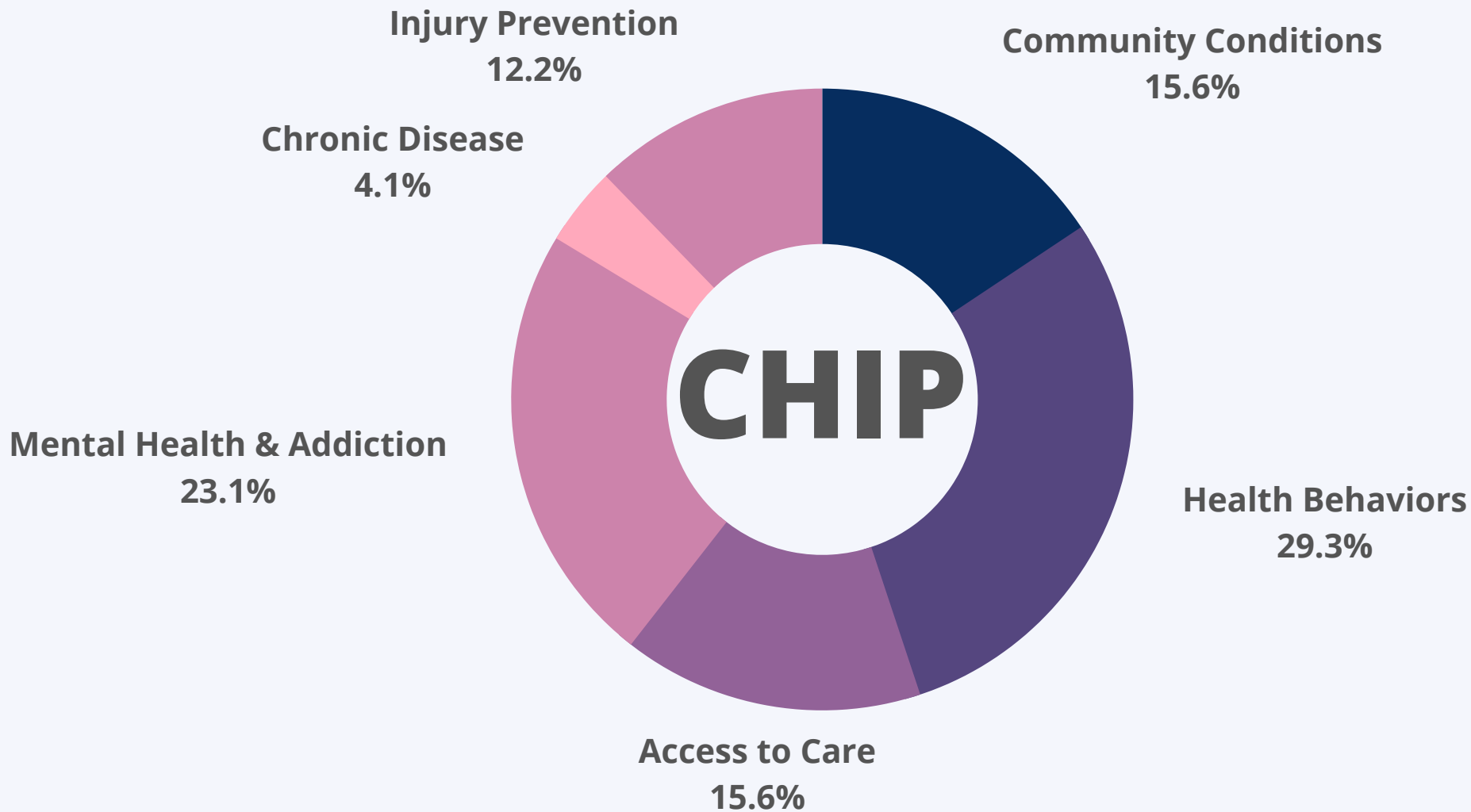

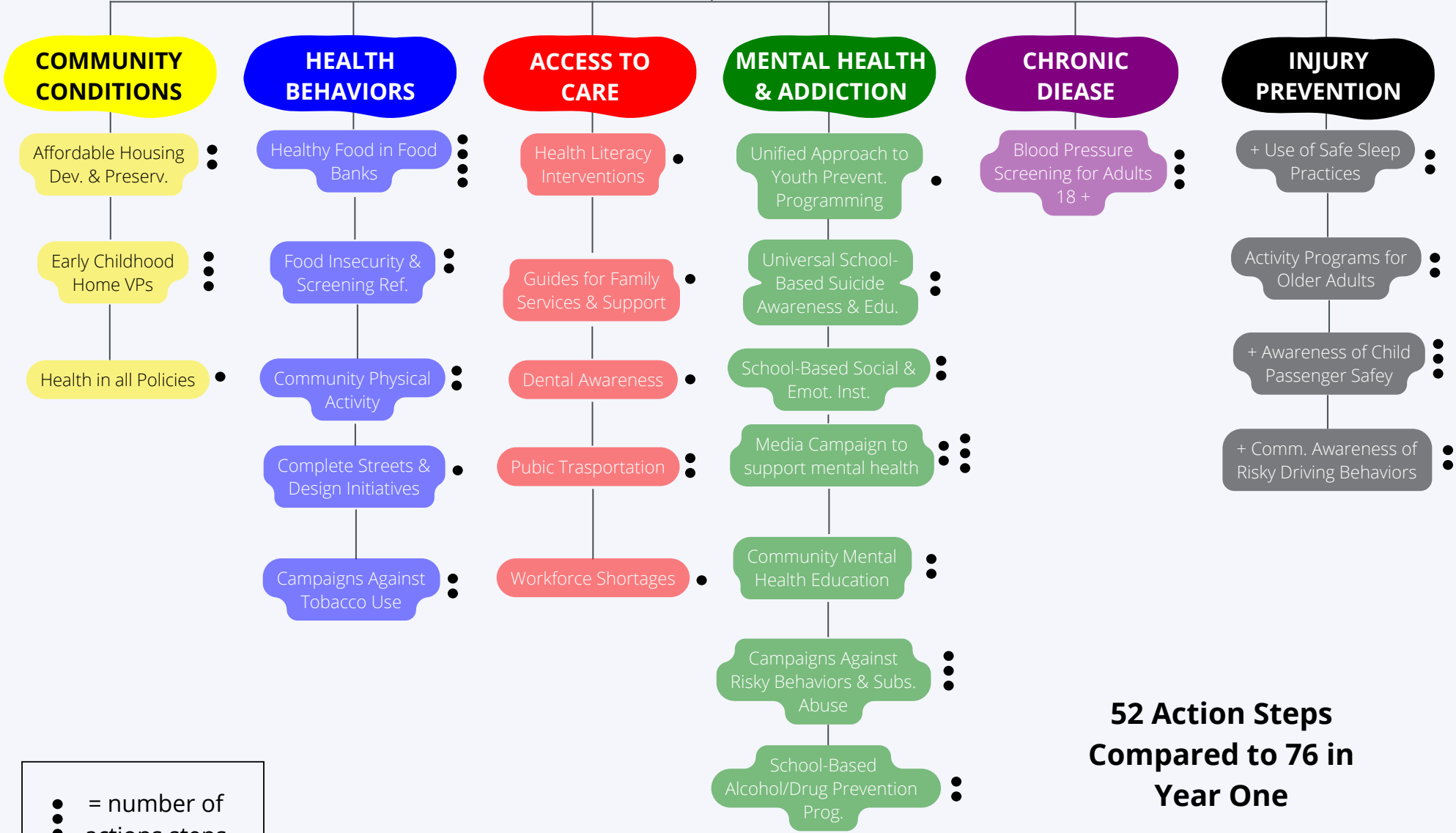

The weights were based on the total number of action steps in each strategy compared to the total action steps in the CHIP (all priorities combined)

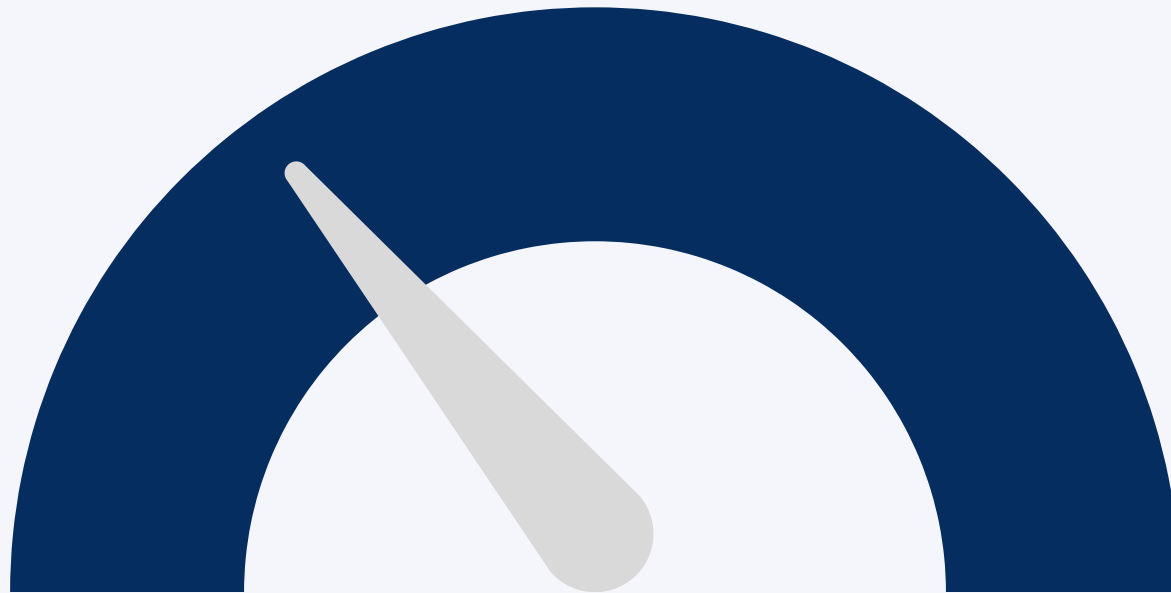

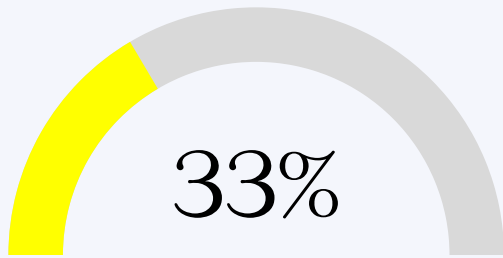

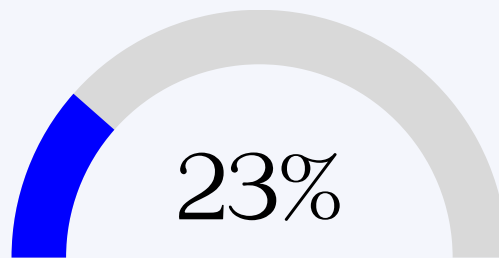
